A word from the chair

The virus situation in the West Bank and Gaza has worsened in the last few weeks. From 500 cases in mid-June there are now 7,037 confirmed cases. Hebron has the worst record at 4,786 cases, Bethlehem 404, Nablus 228, Ramallah 267, Gaza 72 and **Sabastiya has its first two cases** who were removed to a quarantine centre. Everyone in the village is being tested. We are keeping an eye on the situation and await directions from Sabastiya on what to do next.

We heard the sad news that on June 8th **the Israeli army arrested the niece of Ahmad Kayed** (aka Abu Yasser, our committee member in Sabastiya) Layan is 22 years old and a graduate of Bir Zeit University. She is detained in a prison near Haifa. Her case has been constantly deferred and she has now been held over for another month when her trial will continue. We hope that she will soon be released. HAFSA funded the delivery of 125 hens to 25 of Sabastiya's families. These hens are already laying eggs to the delight of the families. A huge thank you for all your donations and special thanks to the West Ealing Branch of the Unite Union, who raised money for this project. Abu Yasser had quite a job sourcing all the hens: everyone, including Israelis, are seeking out hens to purchase as the price of eggs has doubled.



This week, we sent a further **£1,650 to Sabastiya to buy clothes and shoes as EID gifts for children in economically struggling families.** We wish all our Muslim friends a Happy Eid for July 31st.

Eid Mubarak !

We held our **first HAFSA Zoom session on July 7th.** Abu Yasser gave us an update on the situation in Sabastiya. We then split into groups to discuss the film <u>"The Last Shepherds of the Jordan Valley"</u>, and to suggest ways forward for our work with Sabastiya. All in all, it was nice to reconnect with friends and welcome new faces.

We have planned another Zoom on **Tuesday August 4th at 6pm.** Our guest speaker will be **Vincent Fean:** "Strengthening Friendship with Palestine, **Countering Annexation**" Details for registering will be sent soon.

A group of UK charities has recently issued a **statement condemning the annexation of parts of the West Bank**. You can see the full statement <u>here</u> and may wish to use information from this to lobby your MP. The group meets 3 or 4 times a year with a government minister to discuss Palestine.

There is no state help in Palestine - no pensions, sick pay, welfare benefits, free at point of use health service, so our friends in Sabastiya desperately need our support.
