A word from the chair

It is with great sadness that we heard the news of Lynne Ringuet's untimely death. Please read below Jean's tribute to Lynne on behalf of HAFSA.

As of August 21st, the number of Covid-19 cases has risen to 10,830 in the Occupied Palestinian Territories (OPTs). There has been **only one recent new case in Sabastiya** and he was swiftly quarantined in the municipality guest-house. <u>Eid al-Adha</u> started on July 31st and HAFSA funded the purchase of clothes and shoes for fifty disadvantaged children and 15 special need young adults. We thank you very much for all your donations towards this project.

Our second Zoom session on August 4th attracted an attendance of 45 people. Abu Yasser, our contact in Sabastiya, opened the session by giving a brief history of our friendship link before introducing our main speaker, Sir Vincent Fean, who was the UK Consul-General, to Jerusalem from 2010 to 2014. Vincent talked about the benefits which friendship links with Palestine bring to both communities. He complimented the work HAFSA does in making Palestinian voices heard and supporting Sabastiya by responding to the needs of the village. He also updated us on the work the Britain Palestine Friendship and Twinning Network (BPFTN) to coordinate efforts and strengthen the network.

Vincent gave us his analysis of the **threatened annexation** of part of the West Bank by the Israeli government. He spoke of the two kinds of annexation, both illegal under international law:

- the systematic daily informal annexation that Palestinians suffer under occupation and
- the more blatant method of officially annexing swathes of land, eg the Golan Heights, East Jerusalem and now part of the West Bank - perhaps the Jordan Valley.

This latest plan would jeopardise any hope of a two-state solution which is the preferred outcome for the international community. However, it is still UK policy to recognise the State of Palestine, but it has yet to do so. The Foreign Office says that the UK will recognise Palestine at a time of its own choosing and when it will best advance the cause of peace. It is important that we **press our Government to recognise the State of Palestine** according to the pre-1967 borders. With state recognition comes certain rights and it will equally be harder for the UK then to ignore the breaches of international law that are committed every day against Palestine. Finally, Palestinians do not seek sympathy but the right to self-determination and to be treated as equals in their own land. Click here to read a fuller account of the talk.

Vincent is currently the Chair of the Balfour Project charity and a Patron of the BPFTN and HAFSA. The Balfour Project holds regular interesting Zoom talks, free of charge and the next talk is on Sep 9th at 3pm when Israeli former Ambassador Alon Liel, who advocates the outcome of two states and an end to the Occupation, will discuss whether the move to annex (which is still on the table, whatever the UAE says) can be a diplomatic game-changer.
